Legion baseball

The Marathon Legion baseball team was eliminated from the Class A Regional Tournament at Marathon held July 23-25.

In the first game on July 13 against Black River Falls, Marathon lost 9-4. Losing pitcher for Marathon was Tyler Hamann with five strikeouts. Leading hitter for Marathon was Brent Krautkramer with a RBI single.

In the second game on July 24, Marathon was the victor over Mosinee, 2-1. Winning pitcher for Marathon was Cody Hanke with a complete game consisting of four strikeouts and four hits. Leading hitters for Marathon were Koleman Schilling, 2 for 3; Josh Ahles, 2 RBIs.

Marathon proceeded into the tournament with a loss on the 25th against Tomahawk; three to four. Losing pitcher for Marathon was Tyler Hamann. Leading hitters for Marathon were Bobby Blume, 2 for 4, two doubles; Tyler Hamann, 2 for 3, three RBIs; and Brent Krautkramer, double.

Marathon was eliminated from the tournament.

Jubilee celebration

Twenty one Capuchin friars will celebrate their jubilee celebrations at the founding site

of the Capuchin Order in America, St. Lawrence Seminary High School, Mount Calvary, on Aug. 7.

Anniversaries that will be celebrated include one friar celebrating 70 years in the Capuchin order; four friars will be marking 65 years in the Capuchin order. Six friars will be marking 60 years; eight friars will be celebrating their 50 year jubilee and two will be celebrating their 25th year in the order.

Several of the jubilarians have ties to Marathon. Capuchin friar Irvin Udulutsch (70 years) studied and was ordained at St. Anthony Seminary and then served as a

professor there from 1960-70. Friar Alexis Luzi (65 years) served as a professor from 1956-70. Kenan Siegel attended theology studies prior to his ordination in 1956; Paul Craig (50 years) studied theology at the seminary; Oliver Bambenek (50 years) served as the librarian at the seminary. Augustine Cops also served at the site. Champion Baer (60 years) also studied theology at the seminary and later was appointed the first Capuchin pastor of St. Mary's in Marathon.

Other jubilarians who served St. Mary Parish, Marathon, include Malcolm Maloney (60 years).

Following the jubilee cele-

bration, David Hirt, a Capuchin friar who just completed his novitiate year, will be making his first profession of vows.

In addition, 18 Cap Corps volunteers will be sworn in to service. Cap Corps is a Franciscan volunteer program and a Capuchin ministry, geared to college age students and graduates, who wish to emulate the example of St. Francis of Assisi and serve the poor and disenfranchised. Service placements include Detroit, Milwaukee, Chicago, Puerto Cabezas and Managua, Nicaragua and Lima, Peru.

The Capuchins are an international community of friars modeling themselves after St. Francis of Assisi. The brothers of the Capuchin Province of St. Joseph, headquartered in Detroit, serve in a variety of ministries including social service, schools, chaplaincy, retreat houses and parishes in Michigan, Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Montana, Minnesota, New Mexico, Arizona, California, Nicaragua, and Panama. Established at Mt. Calvary Wisconsin in 1857, there are currently 184 members in the St. Joseph province.

Community scholarship

Steven Kahan recently received a UW-Platteville Community Scholarship from Marathon High School through the UWP Foundation. The UW-Platteville Community Scholarship Program is designed to focus community support to the high school of a donor's choice. Kahan will use this scholarship toward attending UWP in the fall.
